


Level 3 Team Leader in equine or animal care



This qualification has been created for individuals who would like to develop the leadership skills necessary for guiding teams dedicated to animal well-being. The course teaches important transferable skills including communication, organisation, and problem-solving, which are crucial for managing a team effectively. Participants will become confident in navigating the complexities of team leading within an animal care business, including riding schools, competition yards, veterinary clinics, and farm parks. Working closely with their selected employer and assigned Trainer Coach, learners will develop the confidence and competence needed to oversee daily operations, ensure compliance with regulations, and maintain high standards of animal welfare.

A Team Leader will develop a wide array of capabilities, including:

Knowledge Development

- Understand different leadership styles and organisational cultures
- Build working relationships and know how to facilitate cross-team working
- Recognise performance management techniques including setting goals and objectives
- Develop time management techniques and learn how to utilise tools to support this
- Know how to deliver a project and understand project lifecycle and roles

Skills Enrichment

- Use effective problem-solving techniques to make decisions
- Applying organisational governance and compliance to ensure effective budget controls
- Communicate effectively using active listening and constructive feedback
- Able to reflect on own performance, seek feedback, and understand why things happen
- Establish trust with and across the team, using effective negotiation and influencing skills











Functional Skills

Maths and English qualifications are an integral element of the apprenticeship standards.

These are implemented by Haddon Training's dedicated Functional Skills team and will be delivered either as individual or group sessions, depending on the learner's requirements. Functional Skills in maths and English for those aged 16-18 years old are a mandatory part of apprenticeships in England unless learners already hold a qualification in these areas at the required level. For learners aged 19 and over, Functional Skills are optional.

Qualification Overview

To achieve the Level 3 Team Leader qualification, the learner must complete:

- All mandatory modules.
- All core behaviours.
- The Apprenticeship Assessment, in which all components must be passed.

The apprenticeship is awarded through the successful completion of an Apprenticeship Assessment.

This consists of:

- A professional discussion in which the learner is questioned on the knowledge learnt throughout the apprenticeship.
- A work-based presentation submitted on the Apprenticeship Assessment day. The
 presentation topic is issued towards the end of the apprenticeship, with ten days to
 complete.

The qualification will take a minimum of 15 months (plus 3 months to complete assessment), dependent on a learner's prior knowledge and skills recorded on a skill scan and individual learning plan.

Completing required documentation for people management such as appraisals
Building relationships – motivating and engaging team members and identifying and maintaining stakeholder relationships

Organisational and financial governance – including analysing financial data and reporting

Progression

Upon completion, learners within the equine or animal care industries could transition to the following qualifications if they are in a suitable role and don't already have prior learning or experience at this level:

- Level 2 Dog Groomer
- Level 2 Equine or Racing Groom
- Level 3 Senior Equine or Racing Groom
- Level 2 Animal Care and Welfare Assistant
- Level 3 Animal Care and Welfare Manager
- Level 3 Keeper and Aquarist

- Level 5 Operations Leader
