

# Level 3 **Senior Racing Groom**



Progress in a senior role within the racing industry, and extend the knowledge and skills learnt to include coordinating and supervising the day-to-day care of Thoroughbred racehorses. Approved by The British Horseracing Authority (BHA), this apprenticeship meets the requirements for trainers in England, who must hold a relevant qualification at this level.

A Senior Racing Groom will acquire an extensive grasp of various subjects and master their application, including:

#### **Knowledge Development**

- The supervision of the Thoroughbred racehorse as a high-performance equine athlete
- The specific exercise regimes used in the racing industry to prepare and train horses to race
- The early education of the racehorse including the breaking and training process
- The effective supervision of horses and staff in the racing yard, on the gallops, at the races and at public sales venues
- The Orders and Rules of Racing, technical racing terms, vocabulary, industry structure and organisation

#### **Skills Enrichment**

- Handle Thoroughbred racehorses in and out of full training, including young horses
- Contribute to the early education and training of the horse to prepare for, and improve performance
- Assist in introducing young horses to equipment and tack
- Ensure compliance with all industry regulatory requirements at the races or sales
- Prepare horses at the race and assist with saddling up and the parade ring procedures
- Prepare and lead up a racehorse at the races in line with industry practice and the Rules of Racing





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# **Functional Skills**

Maths and English qualifications are an integral element of the apprenticeship standards.

These are implemented by Haddon Training's dedicated Functional Skills team and will be delivered either as individual or group sessions, depending on the learner's requirements. If the learner has completed Functional Skills previously or can provide suitable evidence, such as GCSE certificates or similar, they may be exempt from completing this element of the qualification.

# **Qualification Overview**

To achieve the Level 2 Racing Groom qualification, the learner must complete:

- All mandatory modules.
- One additional module based on the chosen optional pathway.
- All core behaviours.
- The End Point Assessment, in which all components must be passed.

The apprenticeship is awarded through the successful completion of an End Point Assessment (EPA). This consists of:

- An online, multiple choice knowledge test.
- A practical observation where an Independent EPA Assessor will watch and assess the learner completing a variety of tasks in the workplace.
- A professional discussion which will take place immediately after the observation and will involve a discussion with the Independent EPA Assessor to further examine the learner's knowledge.

The qualification will take a minimum of 12 months to complete, dependant on a learner's prior knowledge and skills recorded on a skill scan and individual learning plan.

#### The Principles of Transporting Horses by Road on Short Journeys

As part of this qualification, we offer the opportunity to also gain a certificate of competence in the welfare of transporting horses on short journeys at no extra charge. This additional qualification enables our apprentices to be assessed and meet the legal requirements for transporting horses on journeys over forty miles but taking less than eight hours.
