

The Principles of Transporting Horses on Long Journeys (Attendant)

This Level 2 award is designed for journeys longer than eight hours. It formally recognises the knowledge, confidence and skills needed to transport horses at the legally required standard as an attendant.

This covers:

- The legislation and procedures for transporting horses
- How to care for and ensure the welfare of horses before, during and after transportation
- How to correctly plan and prepare for a journey
- How to safely load and unload horses for transport
- The due care and attention needed for the welfare of horses whilst being transported on a public highway
- How to maintain equine transport in a hygenic condition

This is a theory and practical based qualification that requires participants to demonstrate practical skills such as loading and unloading.

Learners must be aged sixteen or over to apply.











Qualification Overview

To achieve the Level 2 Award in The Principles of Transporting Horses on Long Journeys (Attendant), the learner must complete:

- An online multiple choice test paper.
- A practical demonstration of preparing a horse to travel including loading/unloading.
- Observation of a journey to demonstrate the ability to maintain horse welfare during transport.

Know how to plan a long journey transporting horses by road

Understand how to prepare horses for travel by road on long journeys

Maintain equine transport in a hygienic condition

Know about contingency planning for horse transport

Evidence for assessment must take place in realistic working conditions.

Tests are conducted at your location, or at a suitable chosen location for a group.

Animal welfare legislation requires that anybody who transports horses for the purpose of economic activity (which is for any business purpose, regardless of whether the business makes a profit) MUST hold a Certificate of Competence for the handling and transporting of horses. Both drivers and handlers ('attendants') are required to undertake training to ensure that they understand the required elements of animal welfare whilst transporting horses.

General Terms and Conditions

The Principles of Transporting Horses on Long Journeys and The Principles of Transporting Horses by Road on Short Journeys qualifications meet UK regulation and are approved by the Department of Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA) and the Animal and Plant Health Agency (APHA).

To support your readiness for these assessments we will provide you with a formal hard-copy training manual. We do not provide any separate training.

Conditions required at an examination site are:

A safe environment with a suitable, warm, dry, and quiet room in which to sit the invigilated test paper. Sufficient space must be provided for more than one candidate if applicable.

Long Journey Specifics

Mandatory premises requirements

Suitable horse (or horses if multiple candidates)

Travelling equipment

Appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) for the attendant

Suitable transport that meets all legal requirements for demonstrating transport on the road
